Item No. 6 To discuss about FRA Updates (UG & Diploma)

Resolution No. 6 Hon. Director informed about the fee declared by FRA for B.Tech and Diploma programmes for A.Y.2023-24. He further added that after appealing to FRA the fee declared for B.Tech programs is Rs.1,40000/- He also stated that the fee proposal for A.Y. 2024-25 is in process. For Diploma programs there is no upward revision in fee for A.Y.2023-24 and the fee proposal for A.Y.2024-25 is in process.

Item No. 7 To update on the Implementation of the National Education Policy 2020

Resolution No. 7 Dr. S. K Patil, Dean Academics updated the implementation of NEP 2020 at RIT. He further added that RIT put forth one step ahead and started implementing NEP guidelines successfully for one early batch 2022-26. He further explained the details of NEP 2020 at RIT as mentioned below –

- Multidisciplinary minor with 14 credits
- Total 19 credits are allotted to different types of projects from the first year to final year
- Three tracks of internships namely, Industry internship, Research internship and Entrepreneurial internship with 16 credits each.
- Courses like Environmental science, Sustainability, Environmental impact and assessment, Disaster management
- Two credits for sports, Yoga, Classical Music, Tabala
- Two credits for the Universal values and Ethics course
- Two credits for Modern Indian language

Hon. Vivek Sawant asked how much percentage of questions are formed analytically. Pattern of questions is to be designed by the institute. We should have a policy for designing of this question pattern.

- **Item No. 8** To inform about Introducing the New Lecture Capture Studio for E-Content Development
- **Resolution No. 8** Dr. S. K. Patil, Dean Academics informed about the e-content development facilities in RIT. He also informed to the forum the purpose of developing lecture capturing studio and details of instruments in the recording studio. RIT's future plan in the content development was discussed in the meeting as mentioned below
 - Integration with Learning Management Systems (LMS): Seamlessly integrate recorded lectures with the institute's LMS to streamline access for students and instructors and facilitate content management.
 - To float online courses on professional platforms like UDEMY, COURSERA etc.
 - To record lecture series for courses under three internship tracks for final Year B. Tech. Following are the course,
 - Finance for Engineers
 - Engineering Management & Economics
 - Project Management
 - Commercial Aspects of the Project

Hon. Dr. M. P. Ravindra suggested that we can float the "Project Management" from 2^{nd} year so that the students will become job ready. Hon. Bhagatsinh Patil suggested that keeping all these subjects in the syllabus, core subjects should not be suffered. Hon. Vivek Sawant suggested that we can record the lectures in Ted-X format as this

format is internationally accepted. He also suggested to connect these recordings to Dnyanganga. Hon. M. P. Ravindra suggested that we need to work for Professor of Practice and for that we should write a request letter to HR and various companies.

Item No. 9 To inform about NBA Status

Resolution No. 9 Hon. Director informed about recently reaccredited Degree Engineering Programs by NBA. He further added that following programs are accredited from 01-07-2023 to 30-06-2026

- UG Mechanical Engineering
- PG Computer Science & Engineering
- PG Power Systems and Power Electronics

He also informed about the visit of NBA compliance committee for following Diploma programs –

- Electrical Engineering
- Mechanical Engineering

He presented the percentage of accreditation for UG, PG and Diploma programs. Total 88.88% programs are accredited by NBA.

Item No. 10 To discuss about R & D Updates

Resolution No. 10 The discussion took place regarding the R&D updates in the meeting. Hon. Director informed that since July 2023, number of publications in Scopus/Web of Science Indexed Journal is 78. Number of publications in Journals on Engineering Education is 28. As far as the patents are concerned, since July 2023, 17 patents are filed, 14 patents are granted and 7 patents are under filing. Hon. Director informed that 2 R&D Engineers are specifically recruited for the product designing purpose. Dr. A. B. Kakade, Dean R&D showcased the newly developed products such as sugarcane dry leaves removing machine, tractor driven machine, electric driven machine, sheet metal fabrication etc. He further informed about ongoing consultancy and R&D projects like Zero Liquid Waste Discharge Project, Graphene Production, Indrayani River Basin Management, Carbonized Bio-fuels from Bagasse Fly Ash and Cashew Nut Shell Briquettes etc.

Hon. Bhagatsinh Patil suggested to tell the report of tractor driven machine after the trials. Hon. Vivek Sawant has suggested that educational institutes should focus on ecosystem development. Hon. M. P. Ravindra suggested that quality of paper publication is to be enhanced and we should also see that the quality of publications should be checked at the time of recruitment.

Item No. 11 To update the Progress of Incubation Activities

Resolution No. 11 Hon. Director informed the formation of incubation team which includes Director of NETRA-RIT foundation, CEO, Incubation associate, Dean R&D, Incubation manager and start-up co-ordinator.

Item No. 12 To discuss about ongoing Infrastructural Developments

Resolution No. 12 Hon. Director informed about ongoing construction progress of Academic Building no. 1. He informed that the building comprises a total of seven floors, including the ground floor. The total built-up area of the structure is 65,000 Sq.Ft.. The estimated cost of the building for civil work alone amounts to Rs. 10 crore. The total expenditure incurred stands at Rs. 9.06 crore. The funds required amount to Rs. 0.94 crore. An additional Rs. 3 crore is necessary for other essential works such as electrical installations, lifts, firefighting systems, the guest banquet hall, and the computer centre.

Regarding the progress of Gymnasium building he explained that the Gymnasium Building consists of a ground floor and one additional floor. The total built-up area of the building is 31,593 Sq.Ft, with Phase I covering 18,161 Sq.Ft. The total estimated cost for constructing the Gymnasium Building is Rs. 8.33 crore. The estimated cost for Phase I

work amounts to Rs. 4.25 crore and total expenditure incurred for Phase I work is Rs. 1.51 crore. Funds required for Phase I work total Rs. 3.67 crore. The total funds required for both Phase I and Phase II work sum up to Rs. 6.82 crore.

He further added that the International Hostel Building (for boys) features a ground floor and four additional floors, with a built-up area of 17,896 Sq.Ft. for the mess on the ground floor and 50,560 Sq.Ft. for the hostel across four floors, resulting in a total built-up area of 68,456 Sq.Ft. The estimated cost of the building is Rs. 23.32 crore, with total expenditure reaching Rs. 5.47 crore and a fund requirement of Rs. 17.85 crore. Key features include two mess halls accommodating a total of 844 students, 32 single occupancy rooms per floor (8 on each of the 4 floors), 88 double occupancy rooms (22 on each floor), totalling 208 students across all floors. Hon. Bhagatsinh Patil suggested that all projects should have a timeline.

He briefed about the following proposed laboratory development for the department of Robotics and Automation -

- Basic Robotics Laboratory
- · Analog and Digital Electronics Laboratory
- Robot Operating System Laboratory
- Modelling and Simulation Laboratory
- Robot Design Laboratory

He also briefed about the development of 2 Computer Labs for Mechatronics Engineering Department and 1 Computer Lab for CSE (AIML) Department.

Item No. 13 To inform about the Placement Statistics

Resolution No. 13 Hon Director presented the placement data to the forum. He informed that for B.Tech, total 323 students are placed out of 450 i.e.72% till date. He informed that the average package is 4.25LPA. He also informed that placement of MBA and Diploma are 67.14% and 74.35% respectively till date and the average package is 3.30LPA and 2.01LPA respectively.

Item No. 14 To inform about RIT's International Relations

Resolution No. 14 Hon. Director informed about the MoUs signed with 25 International Universities from USA, Canada, UK, Germany, Taiwan, France, Philippines, Russia etc. He also informed about Global Education Fair 2K24 held in January 2024. He briefed the list of participated Universities in this Global Education Fair 2K24. He also informed that 11 Students from RIT MBA got selected for Students Exchange Credit Transfer Program and out of 6 Students got 100 % Academic Fee Waiver. He presented the details of International admissions for A.Y.

2023-24 and informed that total 55 international students are studying in RIT in this academic year. Regarding the Senior Expert Services (Sponsored by German Govt.) 2024, he informed that Prof. Wolf Burger SES Expert has accepted our proposal of Electrical Engineering and Mechanical Engineering and he will join us in the First week of August. He briefed about Admission at Esteemed Universities and International Internship Program.

- **3. NBA / NAAC Visit –** Hon. Director informed about his visits to different institutes as an expert on NBA and NAAC committees.
- **4. Mentor Institute for NBA / NAAC Evaluation –** He informed that RIT has been chosen as mentor institute for NAAC accreditation by the Shivaji University, Kolhapur and a mentor institute for NBA accreditation by the DTE, Maharashtra.
- **5. Appointment of Auditor for 2024 25 –** Hon. Director informed that we have appointed M/s PC Patil & Associates as an Auditor for financial year 2024-25.

Resolution no. 16a Hon. Director informed that we have received letter of Approval from AICTE for starting new course – Bachelor of Computer Application (B.C.A.) from A.Y. 2024-25. As the tuition and development fee is not decided by FRA in this academic year, it was unanimously resolved in the meeting that the tuition fees for 1st year B.C.A. should be fixed at Rs. 55,000/- for A.Y. 2024-25 at institute level. Development fee will be charged as per directives of Shivaji University.
