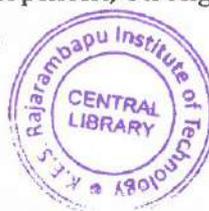

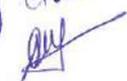

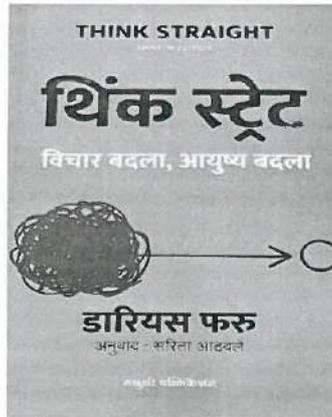

3. Ask self. "Will the outcome of a decision change the way I live?" If you ask that yourself consistently, you'll find that you automatically filter out useless information and only make decisions that have an actual impact on the outcome of your life.
4. Training your mind happens in stages- and before you can move on to the next phase of your learning development, you have to get through a wall.
5. Both learning skills and developing yourself happen in stages. At the beginning of a new stage, things are easy to learn because everything is new. But the closer you get to the end of a stage, things get more difficult.

- Two types of minds
 - Conscious mind – rational mind- objective mind

 - The subconscious mind is the part of the mind that is not in the state of awareness. This part of mind contains the memory banks, thought generators, emotions generators, a sensory input controller, and a dedicated storage for habits.
